As it seems we are not progressing (and may be regressing) as a society in the area of civility, I've decided to again print an excerpt of some comments I made in the Feb. 2014 edition of our newsletter.

“ Part of our charge as a school is to show our students the proper way to use the tools they'll have available in the future. With the ubiquitous habits of digital communication by our kids, it's our duty to help them understand both the positive and negative applications of technology that are already in their hands. However, if we really examine the issues they face, it's not about technology, but about the lack of civil discourse and respect that we face in our society today. In other words, we don't seem to know how to treat other human beings anymore.

Why should we expect our students to communicate differently when our culture no longer values compassion and respect for all points of view? The message provided to our youth is that the world runs only on oppositional perspectives. Is the norm in our society to viciously attack anyone who disagrees with you or anyone who may seem to be different? Miami Herald writer Leonard Pitts penned a column about how we seem to have lost the idea of being civil. He wrote that we have seen “cruelty...become acceptable . . . even commonplace” in all aspects of our society. Pitts argued that we should not solely blame the anonymity of the Internet, because there are many instances of individuals showing “sadistic and personal meanness” to others, then signing their name to it – especially in the world of politics.

Albert Einstein was quoted as saying “It has become appallingly obvious that our technology has exceeded our humanity” but if we blame the tools we're just blaming symptoms. Facebook, YouTube, Snapchat, Foursquare, Instagram, Tumblr and other social media might make it easy to throw your opinions and ideas out there, but what goes out on the web is really just a reflection of who we are. **The idea of being “civil” to one another is disappearing from our radar . . . but what we as a society need to do is reinstate those behaviors in all aspects of our culture. Our challenge is to find opportunities to model tolerance and civil behavior, even when in serious disagreement with someone. Perhaps if our kids see more of that behavior from adults, it will become their nature to treat people with respect in everything they do.**”

Nominations submitted on the appropriate form will be accepted from any patron of the District. Nominations must be submitted no later than March 31st of each year. Members of the Board of Education will review nominations and make the final selection.

A Master Teacher Award plaque will be presented to each winner, and a cumulative plaque is displayed in Central Office with the winners' names added as awarded.

FEBRUARY GUIDANCE NOTES:



For All Students and Parents

- Registration for the 2018-19 school year is quickly approaching. I will be visiting classes in early February to discuss the registration process and students should be coming home with their registration materials for a required parent signature. After this has been done, registration will open on Infinite Campus for students to enter their class selections. Registration for next year will be completed by the end of the month.
- Tutors are available to student in a variety of subjects. A list of available tutors has been shared with all teachers and is also available in the guidance office.
- Just a reminder that 230 credit hours are required for graduation. If students fail classes they don't earn any credits and required classes must be retaken.
- Be sure to take advantage of the many college and military recruiters who visit HHS. It will always be in the announcements when we will have them in our school. They are in the commons over the lunch hour.

Seniors

- College bound seniors should be finalizing their enrollments at their college of choice. Enrollment deposits, housing deposits, and signing up for new student orientation are some important upcoming tasks.
- Students who haven't made a final college choice should be working hard on making a final decision. If that means another visit to campuses you are considering, do it sooner rather than later!
- Updated scholarship lists are posted on the guidance page at www.dusters.org. Seniors also have access to the list through the Google Drive.
- Students entering the workforce should be working on keeping their resume updated so that it is ready when applying for jobs. I'm happy to help anyone with making sure the resume is in order.
- February 12 is the deadline for the Warren and Velda Wilson Foundation scholarship. This is a new scholarship available to our students for the first time this year.
- February 15 is the deadline for the Phelps County Community Foundation scholarships. All students should be pursuing this fabulous local opportunity.
- March 1 is the priority deadline for many college scholarships.

Juniors

- Juniors should be thinking about making at least one college visit in the spring. Be sure to prearrange your visit and try to be on campus when school is in session. It is recommended that seniors begin the school year with their college choices narrowed down to four at the most. Stop in the Guidance office if you need any help arranging visits. Students with good attendance are allowed a total of three college visit days that do not count against your attendance between the junior and senior years.
- Take advantage of the free ACT Online Prep that is available to all juniors in order to prepare for the April 3 statewide ACT for juniors. All HHS juniors have been given access to this, which normally charges a fee. These scores will count for college admission.
- HHS is a test site for the nationwide April 14 ACT. Registration deadline for that test date is March 9. Register at www.act.org.

-For anyone wanting additional ACT practice, the John Baylor On To College ACT test prep course is available at a cost of \$20. This allows students to use the program until the new edition is issued, normally in the fall. You may sign up in the guidance office. You can also follow On To College on social media as well as listen to the podcasts. They provide a wealth of information to help you navigate the college process.

-Now is a great time to make sure you are signed up on www.educationquest.org. They are a source of very valuable college information that is Nebraska-specific. The services they provide are free!

Sophomores

-Sophomores who might be interested in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) should be watching the announcements for information about signing up to apply to attend this summer's camp. Members of the local Rotary will be arranging interviews with the students to select attendees at their annual leadership camp to be held in July.

PROM AT HOLDREGE HIGH SCHOOL: While prom is scheduled for March 17, 2018, we know many of the girls are starting to shop for prom dresses. Remember that Holdrege High School does have a dress code for prom. The dress code applies to all students and their guests attending this event. Holdrege High School students and administration developed this dress code. If you have questions about the dress code, please feel free to contact the high school office.

Prom Dress Code Reminder

Prom is an important and integral part of the school experience at Holdrege High School and for the Holdrege community. Prom provides an opportunity for students and faculty members to interact at a formal social event. Preserving prom as a formal social event and positive learning experience for students is a priority for Holdrege High School.

Everyone attending prom, including guests, is expected to dress and behave appropriately for a formal evening social event. This would include the following guidelines:

Young men are expected to wear formal evening attire that would include a tuxedo, suit with a tie, or sport coat and slacks with a tie.

Young women are expected to wear formal evening attire that would include a formal evening gown or other similar dresses/outfits. Dresses may not expose a bare midriff or have a side slit higher than the tips of the wearer's fingers when the wearer's hands are at her sides. Two-piece dresses/outfits are allowed provided that they do not expose any midriff.

- Body piercings other than those specified in the handbook are not allowed.
- Exposed tattoos are not allowed.
- Public displays of affection other than holding hands are not permitted.
- All other Holdrege High School behavior rules will apply for the entire evening.

Prom is intended to be a fun and positive learning experience for all students. The above guidelines will be enforced for the prom dinner and dance. Faculty members will make the final decision as to whether a student's dress and behavior are appropriate. Students and guests may be asked to leave prom if their dress or behavior does not meet the above guidelines
