### **MAY GUIDANCE NOTES:**

### ALL STUDENTS

Schedules for the 2018-19 school year have been completed and released for all 8-11 students. Schedule changes for first semester will be allowed until Friday, August 17th.

Be aware that peer tutoring continues to be available as we wind down the school year. I urge everyone to finish strong!

### **SENIORS**

- Honors Night will be held on Monday, May 7, 7:00 p.m. at the Tassel. All seniors are encouraged to be in attendance. Local scholarships will be awarded. Be sure to pay attention to the guidelines for claiming scholarship monies and remember to do that for both semesters.
- Remember to thank the organizations and/or individuals who are awarding scholarships to you by sending thank you notes soon after graduation.
- College bound students are reminded to pay attention to all correspondence from the college or university you will be attending. You don't want to miss important messages regarding new student orientation, housing, financial aid, etc.
- All graduating students are reminded that if the dusters.org email has been your primary email address, you should change that preference with your college and other organizations so that you will continue to receive important messages. We have encouraged you to use another account as you have completed college and scholarship applications since the dusters.org account will be disabled prior to the start of next school year.
- Valuable information for students is posted on the guidance page at <a href="www.dusters.org">www.dusters.org</a>. This includes the Parchment link where students can request transcripts be sent. Seniors will have to request their final high school transcript be sent to their college.
- If you have taken classes for college credit you must request those grades be sent to the college you will be attending in order for them to be included in your college information.
- <u>www.educationquest.org</u> continues to be a source of excellent information for students. Check out the Repayment Calculator to figure out your future loan payments, or check the College Students section for tips on how to be prepared for college.
- Best wishes to all students as you pursue your next phase of life!

### **JUNIORS**

- All juniors participated in statewide ACT testing on April 3. Many students have received their score reports; all scores should be received by the end of the school year.
- Four opportunities remain for you to take another ACT test to count for scholarship consideration: June 9, July 14, September 8, October 27, and December 8. HHS is a testing center for the October and December test dates. Registration deadline for the June ACT is May 4. Register at <a href="https://www.act.org">www.act.org</a>. You can use your registration information to link your account information. If you need help with that, come into the guidance office for help.

- You are encouraged to be actively pursuing options for after graduation. Summer is a good time to visit campuses and help you begin to narrow your college choices. You should have narrowed your choices to four by the beginning of the school year.
- Families of juniors: be aware that the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will open on October 1, 2018 and you will use your 2017 tax information. This is essential to determine need-based financial aid and is also a component of many scholarship applications.
- Students considering participating in college athletics should register at <a href="www.playnaia.org">www.playnaia.org</a> for the NAIA level and <a href="www.eligibilitycenter.org">www.eligibilitycenter.org</a> for the NCAA level.

# HPS Begins Using Standard Response Protocol from National Safety Organization

Holdrege Public Schools has begun to use some updated terminology and response plans for safety protocols in our buildings. A national non-profit foundation, called iloveuguys.org grew out of a school shooting situation many years ago, and now makes these thoroughly vetted plans and training materials for schools around the country. As the district and each building goes through reviews of our policies and plans, we look for ways to incorporate ideas that are not only sound practice, but that are easy to understand and promote. The SRP from iloveuguys.org fits this criteria wonderfully. Students have already seen the materials around HHS and have used the terminology in one of our drills. We will continue to train the staff, students and patrons on our use of the process, and that begins with a handout that will go home with each student before the year is out. A copy of this handout is included in the May HHS Newsletter. Please take some time to discuss this topic with the students in your household, and, as always, call individual buildings when you have questions or concerns.

EVACUATE - "To the Announced Location"
SHELTER - "For a Hazard Using a Safety Strategy"

- Recover students and staff from outside building
- Increased situational awareness
- Do business as usual
- Take roll, account for students

### LOCKDOWN LOCKS, LIGHTS, OUT OF SIGHT

Lockdown is called when there is a threat or hazard inside the school building.

### STUDENTS:

- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence

### **TEACHERS:**

- Lock classroom door
- Lights out
- Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Wait for First Responders to open door
- Take roll, account for students

# EVACUATE TO A LOCATION

Evacuate is called to move students and staff from one location to another.

### STUDENTS:

- Bring your phone
- Leave your stuff behind
- Form a single file line
- Show your hands
- Be prepared for alternatives during response.

### **TEACHERS:**

- Grab roll sheet if possible
- Lead students to Evacuation Location
- Take roll, account for students

### SHELTER

### FOR A HAZARD USING SAFETY STRATEGY

Shelter is called when the need for personal protection is necessary.

### SAMPLE HAZARDS:

- Tornado
- Hazmat

### **SAMPLE SAFETY STRATEGIES:**

- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
