Illness

With the recent concerns of COVID-19 we ask that in-home monitoring of COVID like symptoms be more diligent in efforts to help us control any possible illness spreading. Any student with persistent cough, difficulty breathing, chills, body aches, fever (100 degrees or greater), vomiting, diarrhea, and/or loss of taste and smell should be kept at home. It is highly recommended that symptoms be evaluated by your child's doctor and appropriate testing be done as well. Students experiencing any of these symptoms will be sent home. Students need to remain at home until they are fever AND symptom free for 72 hours (this time frame due to our ORANGE risk level).

Reminder that the use of a "gaiter" face covering is not permitted to be worn. All students and staff must wear standard mask face and nose coverings.

Holdrege Public Schools is getting guidance from our local health care professionals for all policies and recommendations. Feel free to contact the Acute Care Clinic if you have any additional concerns or questions that our administration or school nurses have not clarified for you.

We appreciate your cooperation and efforts. Together we can keep our st<mark>udents in their classrooms to the best of our ability this school year.</mark>

Absences

If your child is going to be absent, please call the school office before 8:00 to inform us of the absence. If you know ahead of time that your student will be absent, please send a note, call the school office or e-mail the school secretary. We will attempt to contact you if your student is absent and you have not contacted us. If we do not have contact with you and are not informed of the reason for absence, the absence will be considered unexcused. It is also important that you inform us of the reason for the absence, especially when due to illness as we are required to report illnesses to the Health Department on Wednesdays.

Medications at School In order for school staff to administer medication at school, parents must fill out a medication consent form. This includes prescription and non-prescription medication. Additionally, prescription medications must be in the original labeled bottle or container from the pharmacist with the child's name, name of medication, and dosage. Non-prescription or over-the-counter medications need to be in the original labeled container/bottle. This is in compliance with Nebraska State law. From the Counselor's Corner

Hoping that your child's year is off to a great start!!! The students have been amazing, coming into school and faithfully wearing their masks and getting their temperature checked. It has been so fun to have the halls full of excited students ready to learn.

As the Guidance Counselor here is what I do at school:

I can help with: organization, time management, test taking tips, friendships, goal setting, coping strategies for stress, anxiety or anger, forming healthy relationships, problem solving and decision making skills.

I am here to: Listen, keep your child safe and be an advocate for your child.

This year, I am very excited about a new guidance curriculum we will be using called Second Step Middle School Program. This program focuses on skills and concepts that are designed to help students both in and out of school.

Best-in-Class Social-Emotional Learning Second Step Middle School is a first-of-its-kind social-emotional learning (SEL) curriculum that's modern, web-based, and responsive to the needs of today's students and educators. It's underpinned by the latest research in adolescent brain development and social psychology. The result is a program that doesn't just help kids do better in school—it helps them do better in life.

Here is what it will the lessons will encompass:

*Mindsets and Goals: Students will learn about ways to grow their brains and get smarter, along with research-based strategies for achieving goals and handling difficult situations.

*Values and Friendships: Students will learn to identify their personal values and use those values to make good decisions and build strong, positive relationships.

*Thoughts, Emotions and Decisions: Students will learn the positive role emotions play in their lives, how to handle unhelpful thoughts and strong emotions, and specific strategies for calming down.

Serious Peer Conflicts: Students will learn how to identify and avoid serious conflicts, resolve conflicts that can't be avoided, think about other people's perspectives, and help stop bullying and harassment at school.

TEAMMATES MENTORING PROGRAM:

Currently our adult mentors are not allowed to come into the building to meet with their mentees. Mentors may use a TeamMates website to email their mentees. TeamMates will be allowing virtual match meetings with their mentee through a secure platform until in-person meetings can resume at the school. (This will be up and going after Labor day, September 7th). Just a heads up to all parents of mentees, You will be receiving a parent permission form about this that will need to be signed and returned to Mrs. Berreckman.
