#### **MAY GUIDANCE NOTES:**

#### ALL STUDENTS



Schedules for the 2022-23 school year were released for all 9-11 students in the past few weeks. Current 8th grade students will receive their schedules on Monday, May 2 when they visit the high school for a tour of the building. Students needing to make a schedule change should stop by the Guidance Office.

#### **SENIORS**

- Honors Night will be held on Monday, May 9, 7:00 p.m. at the Tassel. All seniors are encouraged to be in attendance. Local scholarships will be awarded.
  - Be sure to pay attention to the guidelines for claiming scholarship monies and remember to do that for **both** semesters.
- Remember to thank the organizations and/or individuals who are awarding scholarships to you by sending thank you notes soon after graduation.
- College bound students are reminded to pay attention to all correspondence from the college or university you will be attending. You don't want to miss important messages regarding new student orientation, class registration, housing, financial aid, etc.
- All graduating students are reminded that if the dusters.org email has been your primary email address, you should change that preference with your college and other organizations so that you will continue to receive important messages. We have encouraged you to use another account as you have completed college and scholarship applications since the dusters.org account will be disabled prior to the start of next school year.
- The Guidance Office page at <a href="www.dusters.org">www.dusters.org</a> is a valuable source of information, including the Parchment link where students can request transcripts be sent. Seniors will have to request their final high school transcript be sent to their college. I will assist all of them in doing this prior to their last day of school.
- If you have taken classes for college credit you must request those grades be sent to the college you will be attending in order for them to be included in your college records. HHS does not have the ability to send your college transcript.
- <u>www.educationquest.org</u> continues to be a source of excellent information for students. Check out the Repayment Calculator to figure out your future loan payments, or check the College Students section for tips on how to be prepared for college.

#### **JUNIORS**

- All juniors participated in statewide ACT testing on March 22. If not already able to do so, students will be able to log on to their ACT account to view their scores.
- Upcoming opportunities remain for you to take another ACT test to count for scholarship consideration: June 11, July 16, September 10, October 22, and December 10. HHS will again be a testing site for the October and December test dates. Register at <a href="www.act.org">www.act.org</a>. You should use your ACT ID from the state test to link your account information. If you need help with that process, come into the guidance office for help.
- You are encouraged to be actively pursuing options for after graduation. Summer is a good time to visit campuses and help you begin to narrow your college choices. You should have narrowed your choices to four by the beginning of the school year.

- Families of juniors: be aware that the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) will open on October 1, 2022 and you will use your 2021 tax information. This is essential to determine need-based financial aid and is also a component of many scholarship applications.
- Students considering participating in college athletics should register at <a href="www.playnaia.org">www.playnaia.org</a> for the NAIA level and <a href="www.eligibilitycenter.org">www.eligibilitycenter.org</a> for the NCAA level.

#### **SOPHOMORES**

- The sophomores took the Pre-ACT test in early April The scores have arrived and I will be visiting their English classes to go over the results before school is out.
- If you are beginning to think about college, think about when you may want to take the ACT as a junior; you should *not* wait for the statewide test next spring to be your first experience with it.
- Remember that the activities and experiences you are participating in right now will have a direct impact on making you a desirable scholarship applicant in the future. Try to get involved in some volunteer and community service activities in the next couple of years.
